Syllabus: Grade 3

Course Description

This course is to enable students to become skilled readers of wide range of literature as well as informational text. They will also be expected to read, and respond to various types of text independently or as a group. All facets of the language arts —listening, speaking, reading and writing will be covered in this course.

English Standards

Standard 1: Reading a wide range of informational print and non –print texts by wide variety of writers.

Standard 2: Read and analyze a wide range of literature (oral, print, visual), including literary works by Pacific authors.

Standard 3: Students use a wide variety of foundational skills that provide the basis for learning to read, and connect skills for academic study being seveloped in Palauan and in English.

Standard 4: Students acquire and use vocabulary to create, discuss and critique texts

Standard 5: Students listen and speak for socio-cultural and instructional purposes in a variety of settings, adjusting their use of spoken language to communicate clearly and present knowledge and ideas that serve different purposes and involve a variety of audiences.

Standard 6: Students apply knowledge of language conventions and sentence structure, when writing or speaking to create, discuss, and critique texts.

Standard 7: Students use writing (print and graphic) to communicate with a variety of audiences for different purposes.

Standard 8: Students use a variety of primary and secondary resources to build knowledge on a subject through research projects and to respond analytically to literary and informational sources.

Standard 9: Students develop an understanding of and respect for diversity in language use and patterns (e.g., Palauan) as they make use of their first language to develop competency in English.

Standard 10: Students participate as knowledgeable, reflective, creative, and critical members of a variety of literacy communities
